The total costs include the following

a) Tuition fee for EEA-students	<p>The Ministry of Education, Culture & Science has started the experiment "<i>Ruim baan voor talent</i>" in September 2006. As a result of this experiment, a number of HBO schools, including Hotelschool The Hague, are allowed to charge higher tuition fees on the grounds of demonstrable added value for students.</p> <p>Hotelschool The Hague demonstrates its added value through the following points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - demonstrable international character; - demonstrable strong(er) personal growth; - demonstrable ability to deal with complex problems; - demonstrable favourable position in the labour market. <p>Tuition fees for 2010-2011 have therefore been set at € 2,172 for all students except for non-EEA (European Economic Area*) students. Payment in instalments is possible for students who start in August and who have their own bank account in the Netherlands.</p>
b) School fees	<p>These fees include non-subsidisable expenses, such as expenses for an accident and liability insurance and the maintenance of the high-quality international network, e.g. reputable placement companies.</p> <p>Due to this contribution the restaurants can offer prices that are below the market price.</p> <p>Students pay a contribution for non-subsidised costs of the practicals, such as official internal events for placement students and the graduation ceremony.</p>
c) Skotel, training and study hotel	<p>The Skotel and catering practicals form an integral part of the curriculum. It is compulsory for students to stay at the Skotel (the training and study hotel) during the first year; either at 'de</p>

	<p>Klencke' (Amsterdam) or 'de Zwolsestraat' (The Hague). The fee includes breakfast and one meal a day at school during 40 school weeks as well as access to the Internet during 45 weeks. After the first year students are required to make their own accommodation arrangements.</p> <p>A deposit of € 250 must be paid (in cash, PIN/debit card, or Credit card upon check-in) to the Skotel upon arrival (check-in). This deposit is reserved for repairs of damage to Skotel property caused by students. This deposit is refunded after compensation of outstanding balances or damages upon departure from the Skotel.</p>

Computer/laptop	Although the school provides excellent computer facilities, we do advise students to purchase a laptop. If the student wants to make use of the school's network, then he/she can contact the helpdesk in order to adapt the laptop to the school's wireless network.
Books	Books can be bought from the school's supplier. Other lesson material consists mainly of a course guide and a reader. The course guide contains important information for each course, such as the number of EC's it provides, who the lecturers are, etc. Readers provide additional reading material to supplement the books. Course guides and readers are also available on the school's intranet: www.myhotelschool.nl
Student expenditure for practicals	These average costs include uniforms (for practicals) and a knife set. These costs are for the first year and amount to approximately € 600.
